

## GETTING STARTED



## HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

#### FOLLOWING THE INSTRUCTIONS

Before folding the models in this book, first study the explanation of the symbols and procedures on pages 9–24. Refer back to this section whenever necessary. The models range in complexity from fairly simple to advanced and are presented in that order. The instructions are intended to help build skills and teach techniques in a sequential way.

Each drawing shows two things: the result of the previous step, and the action to be taken next. Before performing the operation immediately shown, look ahead to the next step, or next several steps, to see what the result will be.

On the first drawing of some models, crease lines divide the paper in half horizontally, vertically, or diagonally. These are always assumed to be valley folds and should be made before the first step begins.

Written instructions are provided for each step and should be used with the drawings. In this book, wherever the word fold is used by itself to describe an action, it means valley-fold. The terms upper, lower, top, bottom, left, right, horizontal, and vertical refer to the dimensions of the page itself: Thus "toward the top" means "toward the top of the page." The terms front and near refer to location or motion perpendicular to the page, that is, toward the folder; the terms far, behind, and back refer to location or motion away from the folder. The terms in and inward mean toward the middle of the model; the terms out and outward mean away from the middle.

#### FOLDING

Origami is a geometrical art, and for this reason there is little tolerance for error in the folding process. Small inaccuracies at the beginning turn into large ones as the sequence progresses. Folding on a hard, flat surface is the best way to get sharp creases and precise results. Creases may be given an extra sharpness if necessary by running a thumbnail over the folded edge. Where the instructions indicate that edges (or points) are to be brought together, align the points or

edges carefully and—holding them firmly in place—flatten and crease the paper. Where two points are to be connected by a crease, fold the paper over to make small pinch marks through the points (thus determining the position of the line that is to be formed), and then crease through the pinch marks. Soft creases have their place in origami, too—the appeal of many models can be enhanced by subtle shaping, rounding, and adjustment of the finished form.

#### PAPER

Many different types of paper can be used for origami. The choice depends on the type and size of the model to be folded, the finished appearance desired, and the available type of paper. Basically, any paper that can hold a crease and not tear or crack when folded back and forth is suitable. Some models are designed to use paper with a different color on each side to achieve a color contrast in the finished model. In this book the drawings for such designs are toned accordingly. Commercial origami paper comes in packages of precut sheets, 3 to 10 inches square, usually white on one side and colored on the other side. Some types have multicolored patterns on one side, or a different color on each side. For larger sheets of two-tone paper, various gift-wrapping papers can be cut to the desired size. An accurate paper cutter, the larger the better, or a razor blade and carpenter's square, is very useful for this. (Paper cutters are sold by office supply stores, and-as print trimmers-by photographic supply houses.) Just as inaccurate folding will produce an unsatisfactory result, so too will inaccurately cut paper. A square must be exactly square; a rectangle or triangle must have the exact proportion required.

Some origami models look best when folded from paper that can be molded and can hold its shape. Paper-backed foil, such as gift wrap, works very well for this and is easy to use, although crease marks, once made, are indelible. Look for high-quality paper-backed foils; the color shouldn't fade from light or rub off along creases, the foil shouldn't crack when folded back and forth, and there should be no objectionable odor from glue or glaze. Another possibility is florist's foil, which is green on one side and silver, gold, or another color on the reverse side. It contains no paper: the foil is bonded to a thin plastic film, making it malleable, waterproof, and forgiving of extraneous creases. (The Alligator on the cover and on page 77 is folded from florist's foil.)

It is also possible to make your own foil-backed paper, by bonding tissue to both sides of ordinary household aluminum foil using spray adhesive (available in office and photographic supply stores). The resulting paper is very workable, and the combination of the translucent tissue and reflective foil gives a slightly mottled texture with the appearance of depth. Such a paper is suited for insect constructions and small, complex folds that require much shaping.

There is a technique in origami called wet folding that is especially suitable for models that involve a lot of shaping (many of the models in the photographs were wet-folded). Wet folding requires heavy artist's or drafting paper that contains sizing; the sheet is dampened with a wet cloth or a fine spray before and during folding in order to allow sculpted shaping that becomes rigid when the paper dries. The effect is similar to that obtained with foil except that the model is much sturdier and, for animals, appears more natural. To achieve a natural effect with paper-backed foil, the paper side can be colored (or left white) before folding and then used as the outside of the model—(see, for

example, the photographs of the Woolly Mammoth, on the cover and on page 93, and the Reindeer, page 137).

These are certainly not the only possibilities. Papers found in office, artist's, craft, and packaging supply stores provide a variety of different colors, weights, and textures. For a source of a wide selection of precut origami paper, see The Friends of the Origami Center of America, page 165.

#### DESIGNING

There are several ways to go about designing an origami model. The basic methods are improvisation, alteration of an existing model, and systematic design.

Much of the recorded origami literature was developed through improvisation. The improviser plays with a piece of paper until it begins to resemble something. Only rarely will such a suggestive resemblance constitute a finished model—the paper must be engineered toward the goal suggested by the paper itself, and thus at a certain point free exploration merges with conscious design. There are several traditional bases—regular geometric folded shapes—that lend themselves to improvisatory manipulation, but the four "classic" bases (Kite, Fish, Bird, and Frog) have been so thoroughly explored that it is difficult to develop a substantially new design from them. This book, however, will help with that problem, because it contains many new bases that have yet to be systematically explored.

The second method is to take a model that someone else has invented and change it. The ethics of folding dictate that you must change it substantially to call it your own model. Turning a reindeer into a moose, for example, does not make it yours. If, however, you turn a deer into an eagle, that is sufficiently different to call it your own creation. This metamorphosis, by the way, is not as hard as it may sound. Mammals and birds have four limbs; two deer legs could be changed into the eagle's wings, and the body altered, through shaping.

This shaping, which turns a flap into a leg, wing, or head or otherwise refines the form, can be accomplished with the basic folds shown in Procedures, pages 16–24. Mountain and valley folds are the mainstay of shaping folds; they can change the direction of a flap, narrow a point, blunt a sharp point, and add edges and lines to a shape. Reverse folds can accomplish the same things as mountain and valley folds, but more symmetrically and in some cases more permanently. A flap that has been turned at a right angle with a reverse fold is less likely to come unfolded than one that has been simply mountain- or valley-folded. Petal folds both narrow and lengthen points; a swivel fold (which is really just half of a petal fold) accomplishes the same thing. Rabbit ear folds convert wide flaps into narrow points. Crimps and pleats shorten points, change their directions, and add lines and edges that can define important features that are not actually appendages (especially heads and faces). Sinks can hide unwanted points or edges inside the model.

The third method of design is to use a systematic approach to create a model "from the ground up." Essentially, it consists of developing a special-purpose base for each subject. A base is a regular geometric shape that has a structure similar to that of the subject, although it may actually appear to bear very little resemblance to the subject. The design of a base must take into account the entire sheet of paper. All parts of a base are linked together and cannot be

altered without affecting the rest of the paper. On the other hand, the shaping folds, those folds that transform the appearance of the base into the final model, usually affect only a small part of the paper. Converting a base into an animal using shaping folds requires tactical thinking. Developing the base to begin with requires strategy.

In selecting or designing a base, consider the number and size of points needed for appendages. You may be able to use tactical folds to develop some of the smaller points, such as ears or a tail, or even some of the larger ones (by crimping and pleating, for example). The general shape of the subject and the way in which a base conforms to it must also be considered, although some

simple manipulations can alter the shape of a base dramatically.

There are groups of symmetries and techniques that allow the designer to get any desired assembly of appendages. One of these groups is called box pleating. It is typified by rows of parallel creases that divide the paper (or a portion of the paper) into a grid of squares, and occasional creases at 45 degrees to those. Box pleating may be used for models made from squares, but the technique is especially suited to rectangles. To design a new model with box pleating, imagine an infinitely long rectangle. Divide it along the short side into eighths, twelfths, or sixteenths; each division is defined as one unit. Beginning at one end of the rectangle, lay out the parts of the subject along the length of the rectangle, allocating appropriate amounts of paper for each appendage (for example, a pair of opposing three-unit-long points requires six units of paper). When you've allocated paper for all the parts, cut off the excess, and you'll have the starting rectangle. Crease all the horizontal and vertical unit divisions; crease the diagonals; then, starting from one end, collapse the paper by pleating both horizontally and vertically at the same time to form a base.

Box pleating has been used to produce some of the most fantastic structures yet seen in origami: a working jack-in-the-box, an action cuckoo clock, a steam locomotive, cars, trains, planes, a man with a guitar, and a matador fighting a bull, to name a few. While the rectilinear lines of a box-pleated model are well suited for man-made objects—and in fact, most box-pleated models are inanimate—there are many animals (including human figures) that have been designed using this technique. Box pleating is used in the Butterfly and Frog; and to make the body, hind legs, and tail of the Fox; the body and legs of the Alligator; and the antlers of the Reindeer.

Another group of symmetries has its roots in the classic bases, starting with the Kite Base. It is typified by creases at 22.5 degrees to each other, and repetition of the same basic shapes at different sizes, in powers of  $\sqrt{2}$  and  $1+\sqrt{2}$ . This set of techniques is generally more versatile for animal models, especially those with many appendages. It appears in the Praying Mantis, Crab, Horsefly, Black Widow, Mouse, Collie, Camel, Golden Eagle, Rabbit, Duck, Dolphin, Roadrunner, and the fronts of the Dog in a Doghouse and Woolly Mammoth.

Even systematic design using these techniques is not perfect, however. It is common to set the design constraints and construct a base with the required appendages, only to find it thick or awkward. This can sometimes be avoided by designing with what might be called idiosyncratic systemization—that is, folding that does not follow any particular set of geometric symmetries; the geometry, such as there is, is determined by the desired shape instead of the shape being determined by the geometry. Examples of this are the Giraffe, Irish Setter, Skunk, Penguin, and, to some degree, the Rabbit. Idiosyncratic system-


ization, although not always elegant in the process itself, is often very efficient—in fact, it can be far more efficient than a purely geometric rendering of a similar base.


One way to use this method is to decide, disregarding geometry, where the points should be on the edges of the paper to achieve the greatest efficiency for the number and length of appendages required, and then collapse the paper into a base so that all the points are narrowed and defined, hiding the excess paper in pleats. A disadvantage to this approach is that if there are many such pleats of random sizes, the surface of the model can look messy and irregular. It is possible, however, to align the edges of some pleats and hide the rest (for example, by forming them on the inside of the model—see the Giraffe, page 120) and to achieve a base with lines as simple and clean as any derived from a geometric approach.


Most models, however, use not one, but rather a mixture of different design techniques. The Reindeer, Fox, and Alligator, for example, mix box pleating with kite-type folds; the Rabbit mixes kite-type folds with idiosyncratic systemization.

Much of a model's design is specific to that model, but there are usually parts that are adaptable to other circumstances. By studying the designs of others, you can learn new techniques and ideas to apply to your own creations. The origami presented here will help you in this regard, not just because it includes the ideas of two people, but because the models incorporate techniques from still more people. The Camel and Collie, for example, use techniques similar to those of John Montroll in *Origami for the Enthusiast* (New York: Dover, 1979), in *Animal Origami for the Enthusiast* (New York: Dover, 1985), and in *Origami Sculptures* (Bethesda, Md.: Antroll, 1989). The Butterfly shares its overall structure (although not its symmetry) with one by Peter Engel in *Folding the Universe* (New York: Random House, 1989, pages 292–311). Boxpleating techniques such as those in the Frog were extensively explored by Neal Elias in pioneering work in the 1960s and 1970s. As others have influenced our work, so they may influence yours.




Figure 1: The crease pattern, base, and folded examples of (right) Uchiyama's Frog and (bottom) Weiss's frog.

When you fold using others' techniques, chances are that eventually you will duplicate someone else's work. Don't worry about it. What may be common ground at one point can diverge at the next. An example of this is the Frog, the base of which is extremely suggestive of its subject. Exactly the same base was developed independently in Japan by Kōshō Uchiyama and is used for a frog published in his book Junsui Origami (Pure Origami; Tokyo: Kokuda Sha, 1979, pages 132–136). Even though they share the same base, these two frogs are finished in much different ways (see Figure 1). If the base were more ambiguous, completely different animals might have been developed. This case

shows how detail or tactical folding can create different styles of a subject from the same base. In the case of the two butterflies (see Figure 2), the final appearances are fairly similar; the style difference is reflected more in the strategy of folding. Engel's Butterfly is based strongly on kite-type folding; the one in this book is mostly box-pleated. Of course, models of the same subject can vary in both technical style and visual aspect.


One useful stylistic choice is to create a design illusion that simplifies the subject. This method can be both effective and efficient. For example, the Squirrel (see page 62) really has only one ear; a cupping gives the impression of depth. To redesign the Squirrel to get two separate points for the ears would produce a different model altogether because, in this case, two proper ears cannot be obtained by tactical folding. Although many of the models in this book are highly detailed, as illustrated by the legs and antennae of the Butterfly (see page 143), it is not always necessary, or even desirable, to achieve "teeth and claws" realism. Simple models have the virtue of clean, uncluttered lines. Sacrificing realism for elegance can free the design to be more interpretive or expressive. The Dolphin (see page 27), for example, has only a single point for a tail, rather than a pair of horizontal flukes (as in the real animal); the model, however, is a simple caricature of the subject featuring an action mechanism and makes no attempt at anatomical verisimilitude. Representing a leg by a crimp can create an artistic impression with minimal folding; the Gorilla (see page 36), too, is more abstract. The goal is a suggestion of a gorilla, not a photograph.

Finally, discovering folding possibilities and designing new models are not dependent on completing every model in this book. In fact, several creative masters developed substantial bodies of work in isolation, having known only a few traditional folds. As you progress through these models, feel free at any time to explore your own creative urges, be they merely to manipulate interesting shapes or to develop a subject systematically. If you have trouble achieving a particular result, don't give up immediately. Try a different maneuver or approach. Check to see if perhaps another subject is lurking in the folds. Put the work aside for a while and pick it up again later. Sometimes a model can be designed in minutes, or it may take weeks or even years. Whenever you complete it, it will be your own unique contribution to this fascinating art.

## SYMBOLS


Over the past thirty years, a code of symbols has been developed to communicate origami. The original symbols were developed by the Japanese master Akira Yoshizawa in the 1950s and have been refined further as new and unforeseen requirements arose. To an experienced folder, the origami symbols form a rich and powerful language. Fortunately for the novice, most of them are rather suggestive of their meaning. In this section we show twenty-two basic symbols that are used throughout this book. It is strongly recommended that you take a few minutes to study these symbols and the procedures in the next section, before attempting the models.

#### VALLEY FOLD




When a flap or layer of paper is folded so that the crease forms a trough, that is called a valley fold. A valley fold is indicated by a dashed line, and an arrow with a symmetric split head shows the motion of the paper. In this example, the top of the paper is folded down to meet the bottom, making a valley fold.

#### MOUNTAIN FOLD




When a flap or layer of paper is folded away from you so that the crease forms a peak, that is called a mountain fold. A mountain fold is indicated by a chain line (two dots alternating with a dash) and an arrow with a one-sided hollow head showing the motion of the paper. In general, if the arrow has a split head, the paper starts out moving toward you; if the head is hollow, the paper moves away from you.

#### FOLD AND UNFOLD



When an arrow doubles back on itself, that is the sign to fold the paper as indicated and then unfold it. The paper would thus end up in the configuration in which it started, except it would have a crease where it had been folded. Creases are indicated by thinner lines than edges, as shown; where a crease meets an edge, there will be a small gap, to emphasize its presence and further differentiate it from an edge.

#### PUSH HERE




A small, hollow arrow with a flat tail indicates "push here." Usually, that means that rather than being folded toward or away from you, the paper is pushed in symmetrically, or even inverted. For more examples of this, see the Inside Reverse Fold, page 17, the Petal Folds, page 22, and the Sinks, pages 23–24.

#### **EDGE CONFIGURATIONS**




When a flap with several layers is folded in a short zigzag, there is actually more than one way that the layers can be arranged: the entire flap can be folded back and forth (as on the left), or it can be folded inside itself and back out (as on the right). To distinguish these cases, zigzag lines are drawn next to the model to symbolize an edge-on view (compare the edges of the bottom of the figure to the zigzag line or lines below it).

#### WATCH THIS SPOT




If an unusual step is occurring (the illustration is a petal fold, page 22), seeing where the spot marked with an X goes can clarify the movement of the paper.




Rotation of the model is shown by a circle with two arrowheads on it. The arrows show the direction of rotation (counterclockwise or clockwise); the spacing of the two arrowheads indicates the degree of rotation, such as a quarter or a half turn.

### **EQUAL DISTANCES**




If the folds are to be made so that two or more distances are equal, the distances are marked with this symbol.

#### **EQUAL ANGLES**




If two or more angles are meant to be equal, they are marked off by similar arcs.

#### FOLD OVER AND OVER




An arrow that "touches down" more than once indicates to valley-fold once, and then valley-fold again (and again, if necessary, for as many times as the arrow touches down).

#### **OPEN SINK**




This is a very specific way of inverting a point so that it flattens out completely when it is halfway done (see Procedures, page 23). An open sink is indicated by a stemless hollow arrowhead.

#### CLOSED SINK




In this less common fold, the point is inverted without coming unfolded partway through. When it is complete, the edges will be locked together (see Procedures, page 24). A closed sink is indicated by a stemless solid arrowhead.

#### TURN THE PAPER OVER



An arrow that makes a loop means to turn over the entire model. If the arrow runs horizontally, the paper should be turned over from side to side. If it runs vertically, the paper should be turned over from top to bottom.

#### PULL PAPER OUT FROM HERE



A hollow arrow with a cleft tail indicates to pull out some paper from an interior pocket or in some way to unfold some paper. The arrow will emerge from the place where the paper is to be pulled out.


#### **CUT-AWAY VIEW**






A jagged line is used to give a view of hidden layers of paper, drawn as if the near layers of paper were torn away to expose the inner layers.






A dotted line is used to indicate a fold or an edge that is hidden, and in this respect is similar to the cut-away view. Typically, an X-ray line will be used to indicate the continuation of a fold behind a flap, while the cut-away view is used to show more complicated structures. This example also shows that the mountain-fold line may be extended past the edge of the paper if there's not enough of it showing otherwise. Occasionally an X-ray line is used to show the projected position that an edge will assume in the next step.

#### **NEXT VIEW LARGER**



A hollow expanding arrow indicates that the next drawing represents an enlarged view.

## NEXT VIEW FROM THIS VANTAGE POINT



In three-dimensional models, a view from the side of a model is indicated by this stylized eye; the next illustration is drawn from the point of view of an observer looking at the model from the location and in the direction of the symbol.

#### HOLD HERE AND PULL








A small circle with an arrow attached to it means to hold the paper at the circle (usually between thumb and forefinger) and to pull in the direction of the arrow. These may come in pairs, indicating where to hold the paper with each hand.


## **PROCEDURES**

#### WATERBOMB BASE




The Waterbomb Base is a basic shape used in many traditional folds. To make it, first crease the paper in half vertically and horizontally; then turn the paper over. Now crease it in half along both diagonals. Bring the middle of all four sides together and flatten the paper out with two flaps going in each direction.

#### PRELIMINARY FOLD



The Preliminary Fold is another basic shape (which, because it is a stage in the folding of the Bird Base and the Frog Base, is called Preliminary Fold rather than Preliminary Base). It can be made by turning a Waterbomb Base inside out, or it can be made directly this way. Crease the diagonals of the square first; then turn the paper over and crease it in half the other way. Bring all four corners together and flatten out the paper with two flaps falling to the right and two to the left.


#### INSIDE REVERSE FOLD



The inside reverse fold is a way of changing the direction of a flap that is more permanent than simply folding it over would be. An inside reverse fold is indicated by a mountain-fold line on the near layer of paper and a valley-fold line on the far layer if it is visible (first diagram). There is also a push arrow pointing to the spine of the fold. Inside reverse folds are usually referred to simply as reverse folds in this book.

To make an inside reverse fold, first fold the flap along the indicated fold line and unfold; this is to weaken the paper to make the reverse fold easier. To make the actual fold, spread the near and far layers of paper and push the spine of the moving flap down between them. The flap turns inside out in the process (hence the name reverse fold). Flatten the paper. As you become more experienced with origami, you will develop the ability to make reverse folds without precreasing, but if you are a beginner, it will always be easier if you precrease first.


#### OUTSIDE REVERSE FOLD



The outside reverse fold, which is closely related to the inside reverse fold, is also a way of changing the direction of a flap. While the inside reverse fold turns a flap toward its open edges, the outside reverse fold turns it in the opposite direction. An outside reverse fold is indicated by a valley fold on the near layer of paper (and a mountain fold on the far layer, if it is visible) and arrows showing the direction of motion of the paper (first diagram).

To make an outside reverse fold, first fold and unfold the flap along the intended crease line to weaken the paper. Then, spread the layers of the moving flap and wrap them around the rest of the model. Flatten the paper. As with the inside reverse fold, until you become more experienced, you should always precrease the fold. On narrow points where it is difficult to show both layers of an outside reverse fold, it will frequently be shown with only one arrow, as in the last diagram above.

#### **INCORPORATING A REVERSE FOLD**



Sometimes in the book, a step will require you to "incorporate a reverse fold" while folding layers together. This is what is meant.

#### CRIMP



A crimp is used to change the direction of a flap or point, and to form features such as beaks, muzzles, ears, haunches, and feet. There are several types of crimps.


In the type of crimp shown above, the paper is swiveled from a spot on the folded edge and overlaps at the open edges. In this book, it is shown with an edge configuration symbol (see Symbols, page 11) next to the open edges.




In the type of crimp shown above, the paper overlaps only at the folded edge.



In this third case, above, the paper overlaps at both the folded edge and the open edges. The second and third pairs of crimps above are actually formed by making two sequential reverse folds, as below.




#### RABBIT EAR FOLD



The rabbit ear is a way of narrowing a flap and changing its direction. It is indicated by three valley folds that meet at a point and a fourth mountain fold emanating from that point (first diagram, top row; and third diagram, bottom row). Nearly always, the flap is a triangle and the three valley folds bisect the angles of the triangle. The way to start, therefore, is to crease individually each of the angle bisectors. Then bring two sides of the flap together and pinch it in half. Swing the flap down to the side and flatten the paper.

As the diagrams show, a rabbit ear that uses the same valley folds can go in two different directions. In a model's instructions, arrows (and the location of the mountain fold) will show which way it goes.

The following diagrams show several of the different types of rabbit ears used in the book. (See also Double Rabbit Ear, page 23.)




#### SQUASH FOLD




The squash fold is a way of converting one folded edge into two. It is indicated by valley and mountain fold lines and a push arrow pointing to the edge to be squashed (first diagram). To make a squash fold, spread the open layers of the edge to be squashed and flatten them so that the edge ends up on top of the fold line at the base of the flap, as point X does in the example.

#### SWIVEL FOLD

This is a simple swivel. The swivel action is inherent in many pleats, crimps, and squash folds.




When a squash fold is made while swiveling an adjacent layer, a special kind of swivel fold results. This is shown below.




The swivel fold is a way of narrowing a flap without changing its direction. It is indicated by two valley folds that meet at a point with a mountain fold between them (first diagram). As with most of the other folds, it is most easily executed if you precrease the layers of paper. The two valley folds are then put in at the same time, and the mountain fold is formed when you flatten the paper, forming a collar. The region marked X in the example swivels upward—hence the name.

#### PETAL-FOLDING A POINT










The petal fold is a means of simultaneously narrowing and lengthening a point. It is indicated by two mountain folds and a valley fold that form a triangle, with a push arrow on each side of the petal fold (first diagram). The mountain folds are nearly always angle bisectors, and when you precrease (as shown in the second diagram), you should crease the mountain folds first. Then, crease a valley fold that connects the mountain folds where they meet the outer edges. Next, lift up the point along the valley fold just made, and simultaneously push in the edges on the sides as shown. Watch the two points marked X; they end up meeting in the middle when the petal fold is completed.

#### PETAL-FOLDING AN EDGE













It is also possible to make a point out of an edge with a petal fold. This is indicated in the first diagram. To make this kind of petal fold, first crease the angle bisectors at the bottom (second diagram). Then fold the edge up along a valley fold that connects the top of the first two valley folds. Push in the sides and flatten the paper; two new valley folds that are formed will converge at a single point on the edge. Watch the points marked X; as the petal fold is made, they move in from the sides and finally meet in the center of the model.

#### INSIDE PETAL FOLD













An inside petal fold is a modification of a conventional edge petal fold. It is indicated as in the first diagram. Precrease as for the conventional petal fold, and lift up the edge and bring the sides in as before (second diagram). Then, grasp the sides of the petal fold and pull them apart to each side; the edge moves back down. Push the middle of the edge up inside the model, bring the sides back together, and close the model again.

#### DOUBLE RABBIT EAR




The double rabbit ear is a way of narrowing a point and changing its direction that is more secure than a conventional rabbit ear. (It bears the same relationship to a rabbit ear that a reverse fold does to a valley fold). It is indicated like a rabbit ear fold, except that the valley folds are replaced by mountain folds (and the short mountain fold becomes a valley fold), and a push arrow shows the direction of motion (first diagram). It may actually be performed in a single step, but it is easily done in two steps, as shown here. First, squash-fold the point in the indicated direction. Then, petal-fold the point to the left (in this example), and fold it back to the right without undoing the petal fold. Then fold the sides of the squashed area back together. The result is the same as if you had made two back-to-back rabbit ear folds.

#### OPEN SINK



An open sink is a method of blunting a point that has no open edges and therefore cannot be reverse-folded. It is indicated by a hollow arrowhead directed at the point to be sunk and a mountain fold line that shows where the fold should be made (first diagram). To make an open sink, first crease the point firmly along the fold line. (It helps to crease it in both directions several times to further weaken the paper.) Then, gently pull apart the edges emanating from the point and push down on the very tip of the point, which should begin to flatten out. Continue flattening the tip, until the flattened region expands to the creases you made at the beginning; then push the middle of the point down and close the paper. When successfully completed, all of the edges will be visible at the top of the sink.


#### CLOSED SINK



A closed sink is also a method of blunting a point; in addition it locks the edges of the point together. A closed sink is indicated by a filled arrowhead directed at the point to be sunk and a mountain fold line that shows where the fold should be made (first diagram). To make a closed sink, crease the point along the fold line the same as for an open sink. However, this time, instead of letting the top of the point open out flat, you must hold all of its layers together except for one layer that is spread apart from the rest, so that the point forms a conical shape. Then, beginning from one side, push down on an edge so that it starts to invert; the hard part is getting it started. Once the point starts to invert, push it all the way through until it is completely inverted. None of the interior edges are visible at the top of the completed closed sink. The last diagram shows the distribution of layers inside the model.

#### CLOSED WRAP

The closed wrap is closely related to the closed sink. The following three diagrams show how to fold a shape on which to practice.









A closed wrap is indicated by an arrow that comes from behind a flap to the front of the flap; this denotes that the paper at the back of the flap should be brought to the front (first diagram). What distinguishes a closed wrap from other maneuvers in which paper is pulled out is that the paper behind the flap is continuous—there is no loose edge to grasp. To perform a closed wrap, push down on the flap with one hand and pull the layer of paper out from behind it; the corner of the flap turns inside out and forms a pocket. Then, wrap the pocket around the front of the flap and flatten the paper.









